Guest speaker

Today our guest speaker was Mick Leahy's sister, Donna McMennemin, who practices [Reflexognosy](#). After leaving school at the end of year 9 because she disliked school so much, Donna worked for Sussan for 15 years. She then moved on to being a kinder assistant where her 2 boys attended, then she moved on to student integration at a primary school. She found her spirituality at this time, and moved into doing readings, ear candling and crystal healing in Wallan.
